REPUBLIC DAY



Cultural life of Gujarat (My state) and Chhattisgarh (paired state) comprises varied forms of traditional art and craft, folk dances, tribal dances, festivals and fairs and amusing cultural feast and food.

Language: People of Gujarat speak Gujarati and Chhattisgarh speak Chhattisgarhi. Both are Indo-Aryan language and their script is in Devanagari.

Dress: The people of both states wear attractive bright coloured dresses. Tie and Dye technique known as batik printed Sarees are worn in both states.

Dance: Both states have dance with complex footwork and deft swaying movement in group to accompaniment of beating of Drum. In Chhattisgarh, Salia and Soova dance is similar to Dandia ras in Gujarat.

Festivals and Fairs: In Bastar Chhattisgarh, Dusshera is a ten days festival celebrated in the honour of Devi Danteshwari and her nine sisters. Similarly in Gujarat, nine days festival Navratri is celebrated in the honour of nine divine aspects of Shakti.

Food: Similarities in famous food items of both the states are *muthia*, vada, bhajia, kadhi- pakora, moong dal halwa, khurmi, patra, til-gur, sabudana khichdi etc.

Art and Craft: Handicrafts of both the state are made of bamboo, wood, and clay.


In the period of lockdown I read many books in which I liked the most **'The Bird with Golden Wings'**.



The people here and the people there, whatever we built whatever we made, it all boils down to the emotions we trade! It's the only way to grow,



His father works as a farmer and priest. Pankaj too worked as a farmer till he was in 11th standard. His role of a girl in the village's nataks during festivities was appreciated by the villagers which ultimately prompted him to pursue acting as a career. He moved to Patna after high school where he studied in Institute of Hotel Management, Hajipur. He did not stop doing theatre and was also an active in college politics. He doubted his career in acting and hence worked briefly for

a Five Star Hotel in Patna. After about seven years in Patna, he moved to Delhi to enroll in the National School of Drama, from where he graduated in 2004.

After his graduation, Tripathi moved to Mumbai and performed an uncredited role in the film "RUN". He married his lady love, Mridula on 15th January 2004 and they have a daughter. In his early career, he played mostly negative roles and became synonymous with gangster characters. Later he played a variety of roles and won critical appraisal for the same. "Gurgaon" was his first film as a lead actor in 2017. His 2017 film "Newton" was India's official entry for the Academy Award in best foreign film category. 

FACTS ABOUT MOTERA STADIUM

- The world's largest cricket stadium at Motera in Ahmedabad, renamed as Narendra Modi Stadium was inaugurated on 24th February 2021 by the President of India Ram Nath Kovind.
- Construction of new stadium began in 2016. It has been built at an estimated cost of Rs. 800 crore.
- The stadium is the **biggest cricket stadium** in the world as it has a total capacity of **1**,**32**,**000**.
- The new stadium has f**our dressing rooms** with world-class facilities, and a built -in club house with 55 rooms
- The **stadium is oval** in shape and as a result, whenever a match is played on any of the 11 pitches, the boundary size will remain the same on both sides.
- This is the first time the field of an Indian cricket stadium has been fitted with **LED lights**.
- The club house has facilities for both indoor & outdoor games, restaurant, an Olympic-size swimming pool, a gym, and a 3D project theater.
