ABOUT CHHATTISGARH

How was It Formed ?

Chhattisgarh was part of Madhya Pradesh until November 1, 2000. In August 2000 the Indian legislature passed the Madhya Pradesh Reorganization Bill to create Chhattisgarh. The state was formed by the partition of ten Chhattisgarhi and six Gondi-speaking districts in the south east of Madhya Pradesh. Its capital city is Raipur. It was formed to give special recognition to the area.

About Its Geography

Chhattisgarh is located in the Chhattisgarh Plain, which forms the upper Mahanadi River basin. The basin lies at an elevation that ranges from about 800 to 950 feet (250 to 300 meters) above sea level. It is a structural plain with topographic variations resulting from extensive denudation (wearing away of the earth by such processes as weathering and erosion). Knolls, undulating interflues (areas between adjacent water courses), and valleys flanked by belts of clayey soils are characteristic of the region.

About 100 miles (160 km) wide, the Chhattisgarh Plain is bounded by the Chota Nagpur plateau to the north, the Maikala Range to the west, the hills of Raigarh to the north east, the Raipur upland to the south east, and the Bastar plateau to the south. These highlands comprise mostly erosional plateau forms reaching an elevation of more than 2,300 feet (700 meters) in the Maikala Range and the Dandakaranya hills. Earthquakes are relatively infrequent in Chhattisgarh.

MULTIGRAIN VEGGIES CHEELA

INGREDIENTS REQUIRED:

- 1/4th cup gram flour(besan)
- 2 tsp, whole wheat flour
- 2 tsp, oats grounded or flour
- A pinch, Ajwain
- Turmeric as required
- Salt to taste
- 1 tsp, finely chopped onion
- 2 tsp, finely chopped green capsicum and carrot
- 3 tsp grated paneer
- Oil as required



HOW TO PREPARE?

- Heat a saute pan and add little oil to it.
- Add chopped vegetables and saute for sometime.
- Now add salt to taste and mix. Remove the pan from flame and let vegetables cool.
- Once at room temprature add paneer to it.
- Mix wheat, gram and oats flour in a bowl. Add turmeric powder, ajwain, salt in a bowl and mix well. Keep adding water to form batter like consistency. There should be no lumps.
- Once the batter is formed, cover it with a lid and keep it aside for about 10-15min.
- Heat a pan on medium flame, smear a teaspoon oil and pour 2 tsp of the batter and spread it in circular motion till thin layer is formed.
- Now pour some oil on this pancake and turn into other side. Cook the cheela from both sides. Ensuring it dosen't burn.
- Once cooked, puta spoonful of filling on it and flip the one side onto the other to close it.
- Remove it from pan once it appears crispy and brown in colour.
- Serve cheela hot with mint coriander chutney or tomato chutney.

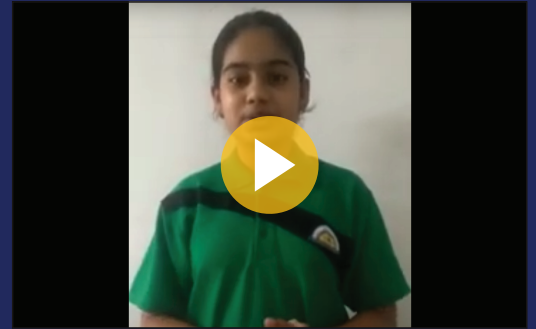

School forms the basis of any individual's character development. School helped me in visualising the dreams, and also equipped me with the necessary skills and qualities to make those dreams come true.

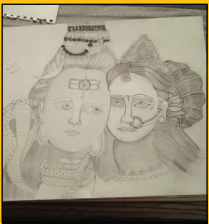
What message would you like to impart to the students of MVP?

Chandra Shekhar Azad was born in a small village in Madhya Pradesh, still remembered as one of the mightiest freedom fighters who shook the British Empire. He grew up with the Bhil tribal children and was extremely fit. He was sent to Benares to study Sanskrit in Kashi Vidyapeeth.

He was then introduced to nationalism and participated in a non-violent movement under the leadership of Mahatma Gandhi. He was arrested and whipped when he gallantly faced the wrath of the magistrate and told his name 'Azad'. He was hurt by the Jallianwala Bagh massacre and turned into a freedom fighter by leaving the peaceful revolution and joined a revolutionary group, Hindustan Republican Association (HRA).

He planned the Kakori Conspiracy to gather more funds and weapons for the freedom fighters. The entire team was declared terrorists and was arrested. When Lala Lajpat Rai died, he planned the assassination of James Scott but mistakenly killed Saunders. He was then backstabbed by an informer and trapped in Alfred Park, Allahabad. He killed himself with his last bullet and created the epitome of patriotism and sacrifice.
