RICH DAD POOR DAD

Description

Rich Dad Poor Dad, written by Robert Kiyosaki is one of the great books written in the field of understanding Finance. He talks over about his own life story where his own dad was a very hard working professor but he could not understand or know about money correctly and he is the one whom the author refers to as 'Poor Dad'. Poor dad believes in getting a stable job and working hard at it to earn money. He also believes that one's financial status is based on one's family background. People know that this mentality traps people in jobs they don't love, but they continue to pay their bills. And his so-called father who didn't even finish his school, had accumulated a lot of wealth in life and he was the one whom the author referred to as 'Rich Dad'. Rich dad believes in working jobs that help you pick up the skills you need to be an entrepreneur. He believes in multiple income streams and also experience-based learning. He believes in owning the ladder, rather than working your way up the ladder. In this whole book, the author discusses the differences that his both dad has with the point of looking money.

Six lessons are there in this book for all of us which serve as a very nice way to understand about money

1) Rich don't work for money, money works for them- Many people are running in a rat-race where maximum people live in a certain way that is to complete the education and then do a job because that's the only way where our regular income generates by slogging themselves because they know they have to earn for money. But the wealthy one's (not those who are inherently rich) for them who earn themselves and then convert it into that works for them. They are the ones who make sure that money works for them but how? By taking out money first for

themselves rather distrusting the credited salary in the form of expenses. Rich people have businesses. Rich people have money working for them. Rich people play the game of money. Rich people work, but they don't work for money.

2) Look for opportunities- The "rich dad" forbids his kids from saying, "I can't afford it." This stops you from thinking further about how to make something possible. Instead, he tells them to say, "How can I afford it?" This enables you to think of ways to make things possible. Look out for opportunities everywhere, and always keep your mind open for new possibilities.

3) The rich buy assets whereas the poor buy liabilities- Invest only if you can get something in return. The rich only buy assets, not liabilities. For example, a house or bonds, these only increase in value as time goes by. Liabilities are things that lose value over some time, such as expensive cars, gadgets etc. As the rich dad says, "The rich buy assets, the poor have expenses. The middle class buy liabilities they think are assets."

4) Mind Your Own Business- Pay off your debts and start investing in income-producing assets as soon as possible. If you want to become rich, start minding your own business. Start buying real assets, not liabilities or personal assets that have no real value once you get them home. Keep your expenses low, reduce liabilities, and diligently build a base of solid assets.

5) Power of corporations- "The harder your work, the more you pay the government." A corporation is the biggest secret of the rich. They use it to escape unnecessary taxes. But what many people don't get is the corporation is not really a thing. It was popular because the income-tax rate of a corporation is less than the individual income-tax rates.

6) Why Teach Financial Literacy? "It's not how much money you make. It's how much money you keep." The knowledge lays a foundation for students to build strong money habits early on and avoid many of the mistakes that lead to lifelong money struggles. Author says "If you are going to build the Empire State Building, the first thing you need to do is dig a deep hole and pour a strong foundation. If you are going to build a home in the suburbs, all you need to do is pour a six-inch slab of concrete. Most people, in their drive to get rich, are trying to build an Empire State Building on a six-inch slab."

 And seed that was sowed.

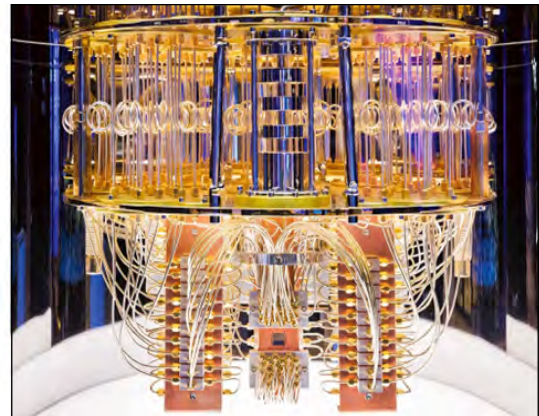

QUANTUM COMPUTING



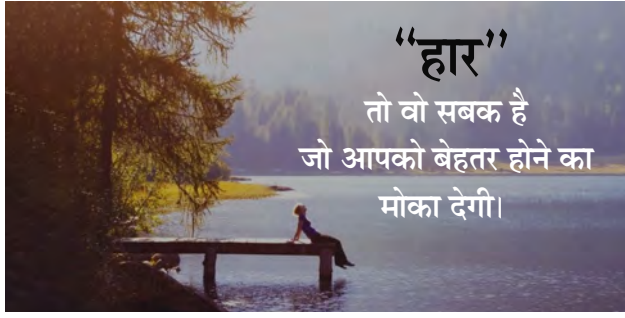
